SEYCHELLES TEL BIOT 59. RESETTLEMENT OF ILOIS.

- 1. YOU WILL SEE FROM TELEGRAM NO BIOT 58 TO SEYCHELLES THAT WE ARE ASKING GOVERNOR SEYCHELLES FOR A MORE DETAILED ASSESSMENT OF POSSIBILITIES OF EMPLOYMENT OF ILOIS IN AGALEGA, ON ASSUMPTION THAT MOULINIE IS ONLY INTERESTED IN COMMERCIAL OPERATIONS THERE.
- 2. MEANWHILE WE ARE CONSIDERING POSSIBLE WAYS OF FULFILLING OUR RESETTLEMENT PLEDGE, IN ANTICIPATION OF RECEIVING LIST OF ENTITLED PERSONS FROM MAURITIUS AUTHORITIES. PROVISIONAL ESTIMATE OF SOME 1,000 PEOPLE IN YOUR TELEGRAM NO 451, IS, HOWEVER, LARGER THAN EXPECTED. ACCORDING TO OUR FIGURES, TOTAL NUMBER OF ILOIS/MAURITIANS, INCLUDING CHILDREN, IN CHAGOS ARCHIPELAGO IN 1964 WAS 658. IN NOTE OF 17 SEPTEMBER, 1968, PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE IN PORT LOUIS NAMED 55 PERSONS AS FORMER EMPLOYEES OF CHAGOS AND AGALEGA COMPANY WHO HAD RETURNED TO MAURITIUS IN 1967, WITH THEIR FAMILIES AND STATED THAT A FURTHER 84 ADULTS AND 56 CHILDREN (UNNAMED) HAD ALSO ARRIVED IN MAURITIUS FROM CHAGOS IN COURSE OF 1968. THERE ARE STILL, ACCORDING TO SEYCHELLES TELNO BIOT 322 PERSONS IN PEROS AND SALOMON. YOU WILL NO DOUBT HAVE THERE FIGURES IN MIND IN DISUCSSING LIST WITH MAURITIUS AUTHORITIES.
 - 3. AS REGARDS THE MANNER OF FULFILLING PLEDGE, WE MUST CLEARLY HAVE FEGARD TO EXISTING ARRANGEMENTS AND POLICIES OF THE MAURITIAN GOVERNMENT, SO THAT WHATEVER WE ARE PREPARED TO DO CAN BE DOVE—TAILED SATISFACTORILY INTO THESE. IT ALSO APPEARS FROM DIFFERING ATTITUDES REPORTED IN YOUR TELS. 432 AND 451 THAT MAURITIUS AUTHORITIES THEMSELVES HAVE NOT YET REACHED ANY DECISION AS TO KIND OF RESETTLEMENT SCHEME THEY REALLY WANT. AS WE SEE IT AT PRESENT, ANY SCHEME FOR PLANNED RESETTLEMENT WHICH MIGHT PUT

EX-WORKERS FROM CHAGOS ON A DISTINCTLY HIGHER LEVEL OF OPPORTUNITY THAN STAY AT HOME UNEMPLOYED MAURITIANS MIGHT NOT BE ALTOGETHER WELCOME TO THE MAURITIUS PUBLIC AND GOVERNMENT. WITH THIS CONSIDERATION IN MIND, SOME FORM OF ONCE-FOR-ALL COMPENSATION PLUS REIMBURSEMENT TO MAURITIUS GOVERNMENT OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE CONTRIBUTIONS MIGHT BE MORE ACCEPTABLE ON THE ASSUMPTION THAT ILGIS WOULD THEREBY EFFECT THEIR OWN RESETTLEMENT. WE REALISE DANGER OF APPEARING TO GO ROUND IN CIRCLES, BUT WE SEE VERY LIMITED VALUE IN OUR TRYING TO FORMULATE A CUT AND DRIED SCHEME THOUT KNOWING WHICH APPROACH TO THE PROBLEM THE MAURITIUS AULGORITIES THEMSELVES WOULD PREFER.
